There is no bad season to visit Israel, the weather in Israel is good almost.



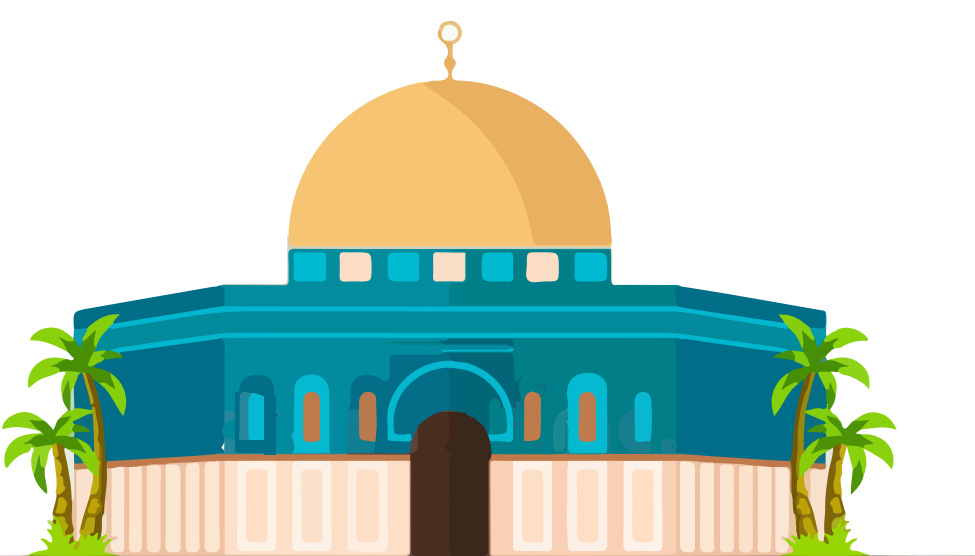
Tel Aviv

Jerusalem is a Capital and largest city



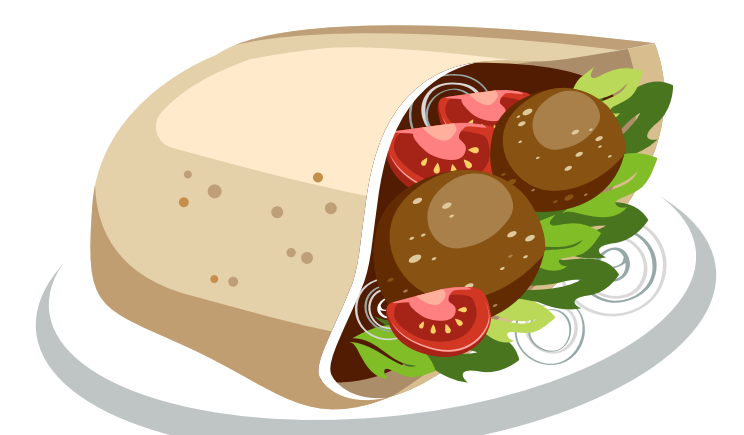
Al-Aqsa Mosque

The Church of the Holy Sepulchre is the most sacred site in the world for millions of Christians. This is the site of the crucifixion, burial and resurrection of Jesus.



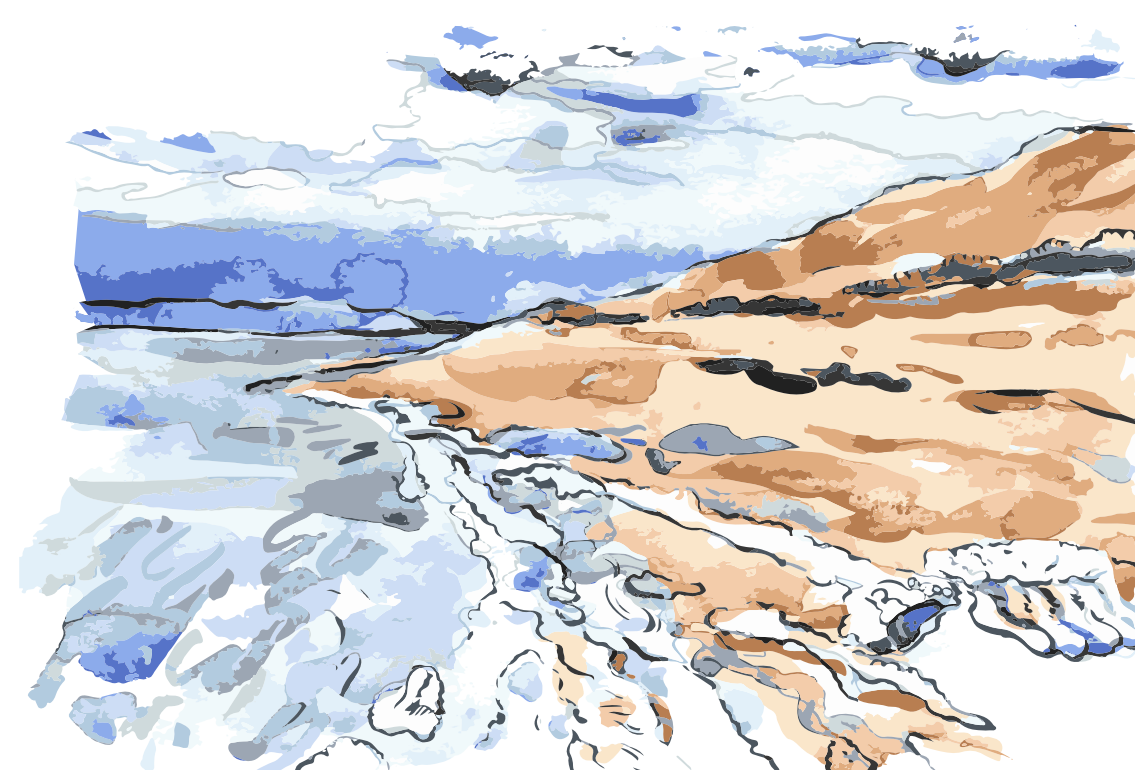
Food
